# How to transfer plants from flasks to pots. By Rick Emmerson

This is how Rick goes about the transfer:

Wear safety glasses for the breaking part & until broken glass is disposed of.

Wrap flask in paper - usually a sharp tap with a hammer will suffice to shatter the flask – separate plants (while still attached to the agar) from the glass, being careful to remove all shards, wrap in paper and dispose into bin. Take plants clumps and wash off agar with slightly warm water mixed with 3mm/lit of algonix. Then take individual plants and spray with a fresh mixture of water/alginox with the addition of growth hormone (1mm/lit). Pot into mini pots half filled (the top half of the pot helps to hold the tiny plant vertical) with #3 orchid bark. Put complete pots into a tray and spray with a coating of Envy (or Seasol – if you prefer).
