## **Anthurium**

There are two groups of Anthurium grown in green houses; flowering varieties and those with magnificent foliage. You mainly find the flowering varieties with their multicoloured spathes and red and yellow tail-like flower spike. They are native to tropical rainforests throughout Central and Southern America and need high humidity and warmth to survive. They are also known as Painted Tongue, Flamingo Flower, Flamingo Lilly or tail Flower. They are grown for their brightly coloured flower spathes and their ornamental leaves. They are part of the Araceae family.

### Light

Bright, indirect light. Do not expose to direct sunlight, except in winter or plants that have been carefully acclimated. They thrive in temperatures between 18°-27 °C. 70° shadecloth is excellent.

### **Potting**

Medium: Must be quite porous and well drained to allow the roots to run but moisture retained at the same time. Mix –together 1 bucket approximately 10lts. Brunnings 'Orchid potting Mix - premium grade coir block'. (Must be a product of Sri. Lanka – there is less sodium (salt) in it. ALWAYS check for the country of origin.1 1/2 Litres Cymbidium Mix, 1 ½ litres Course Perlite, 11/2 litre pre-soaked Peak Moss, 2 litres of fine to medium grade Charcoal,1 ½ tablespoons Dolomite, 2 tablespoons Complete Plant Food, 2 table spoons Blood & Bone, 2 tablespoons Super Phosphate. This mix will keep them fed for approximately 3 months & then apply liquid fertiliser at an interval of approximately 2-3 weeks during the growing period – September to April. From April to September feed at 6-week intervals as they almost stop growing in the cooler months.

Anthuriums thrive when the temperature ranges between 18  $^{\rm 0}$  - 27  $^{\rm 0}$  C. They suffer under about 15  $^{\rm o}$  C

#### **Potting**

Repot when they have filled their current container. Repot in spring. Keep the crown at the original level as it will tent to rot if buried too deep. When dividing a plant always make sure there are at least 2 plants being potted together, they prefer to grow in clumps. They love and thrive on companionship. They can be done singly but this seems to retard the growth of the plant. If there are not enough roots on the plant being repotted, wrap the plant in some newspaper or Sphagnum Moss for 5 - 6 weeks. You will know when the roots are growing as they will grow out of the paper. Keep the paper moist. If cutting long trunks (where the plant is long and straggly) you must seal the cut with Steriprune or a fungicide prior to repotting.

#### **Fertiliser**

They prefer a fertiliser with less than 12% - 14% Nitrogen as they are grown for their flowers & not their foliage.

Remember low Nitrogen in fertiliser for more flowers and high Nitrogen for good foliage but no flower spikes. Every three weeks foliar spray your plants with Epson Salts. Approximately 3 heaped teaspoons to 10 ltrs. This can be included with your fertiliser. Water through the pot every second watering. They also like a foliar spray of fish emulsion periodically.

### **Fungicides / Insecticides**

Never mix Organic and non-Organic fungicides together. A compatible fungicide/ insecticide is Captan (fungicide) and Maverick (Insecticide) can safely be mixed together.
